Regular monthly meeting of the Board of Supervisors, Town of Princeton, called to order at 7:00 pm by Chairman Weckwerth. Open meeting laws met through posting and publication. Motion Dan Kuglin/Gary Anderson to approve agenda. All ayes. None opposed. Motion carried. Motion Dan Kuglin/Gary Anderson to approve minutes of the March 11, 2026 meeting as read. All ayes. None opposed. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report – Treasurer Wagner gives report. Motion Dan Kuglin/Allan Weckwerth to approve treasurer's report and file for audit. All ayes. None opposed. Motion carried.

Maintenance Report – Chairman Weckwerth read a proposal from Brian Stibb to be a part time employee in a salaried position to mow town lawns, using his own equipment, to be paid monthly. Motion Dan Kuglin/Gary Anderson to accept Brian Stibb's proposal to be a part time employee on a salaried position for mowing the town lawns and to be paid per month. All ayes. None opposed. Motion carried. O'Reilly Auto Parts will now be used more frequently for auto part needs. An account will be set up at O'Reilly Auto Parts. Trucks have been cleaned and washed but no plows have been removed. Old plow removal from town dump is discussed. March snowstorm was discussed.

Payment of Claims – Discussion was held in regard to WTA annual membership dues. Motion Dan Kuglin/Gary Anderson to pay claims as submitted. All ayes. None opposed. Motion carried.

Proposed Recycling Ordinance 2026-01 -- Chairman Weckwerth reads ordinance. Motion Dan Kuglin/Gary Anderson to adopt Recycling Ordinance 2026-01. All ayes. None opposed. Motion carried. Ordinance will go into effect after publication and a copy will be provided to the DNR.

Designation of official bank depository – Motion Dan Kuglin/Gary Anderson to retain US Bank as official depository. All ayes. None opposed. Motion carried.

Designation of official newspaper – Motion Dan Kuglin/Gary Anderson to retain Berlin Journal (PrincetonTimes) as official newspaper. All ayes. None opposed. Motion carried.

Salaries of non-elected officials – Discussion held to raise the salaries of non-elected officials to \$25.00 an hour. Motion Dan Kuglin/Gary Anderson to raise the part time employee salary to \$25.00 an hour. All ayes. None opposed. Allan Weckwerth abstained. Motion carried. This wage increase will go into effect immediately.

Salaries of election workers – Motion Dan Kuglin/Gary Anderson to raise election inspector hourly wage to \$20.00 per hour, and the chief election inspector hourly wage to \$25.00 per hour. All ayes. None opposed. Motion carried. This will go into effect immediately.

Dates for open book/board of review – This will be placed on the May agenda. No dates have been proposed.

Chairman’s Report and Correspondence – WTA county unit meeting will be held on April 16, 2026 at 6:30 at the VFW. This meeting is hosted by the Town of Princeton.

Clerk’s Report and Correspondence – April 7, 2026 election went well with 486 total voters. Charity bike ride to benefit Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation to be held in June and a portion of the course will be on town roads.
